Note: Raphael Lemkin is, of course, the originator of the concept of genocide. The above classification is based largely on prevailing legal usage under the *U.N. Genocide Convention* pioneered by Lemkin, and as it is since interpreted and expanded by international courts, including ICTR, ICTY, ICJ and ICC.. The concepts of degrees of genocide, comparable to degrees of murder, are taken from a proposal advanced, independently, first by Ward Churchill in *Alternatives*, 1986, and later by Israel Charny to the Lemkin Symposium on Genocide at Yale University, 1991 (published in Andreopolus, 1994).
